On the 2nd April 1991 the Patricia Pilgrim Nursery School opened its doors for the first time, with a license for nine children, aged from two to five years. An open day held previously during a snowy and very cold February resulted in one solitary uptake. By opening day there were three children attending.

Based at Stebbing Green and surrounded by green fields, without any immediate or adjacent population of families, the geographic reality of high levels of placement take-up seems, today, entirely unfeasible. However timing is everything. The early nineties saw a tremendous growth in Mummies returning to work, three months after having a child. What to do – where to go – where will I safely place my precious new-born?

Over the next five years subsequent applications, extensions and conversions allowed nursery to expand to accommodate up to 60 children, 24 under two years and 36 aged from two to five years.

The logistics required for today's modern family to get children from home to day care and then home again at the end of the working day amazes me. Nursery is so grateful to our parents who travel considerable

distances just to arrive in Stebbing – let alone then drive on to undertake a full days work elsewhere.

Distances travelled by parents and children are equalled by nursery practitioners who in the main have to travel a considerable way to get to Stebbing - sometimes in not very hospitable conditions. (November and December 2010 proved interesting!!!...)

And yet,..... and yet here we all are, twenty years on, a vibrant community of parents and nursery practitioners, all with the same goals and ambitions for our nursery children.

The late Patsy Pilgrim provided the motivation and lent her name. Fay and I provided the fabric. Nursery Practitioners provide their excellent care.

And you our wonderful parents, provide the children and the faith.

Thank you all so very much.

Here's to the next twenty years and beyond.

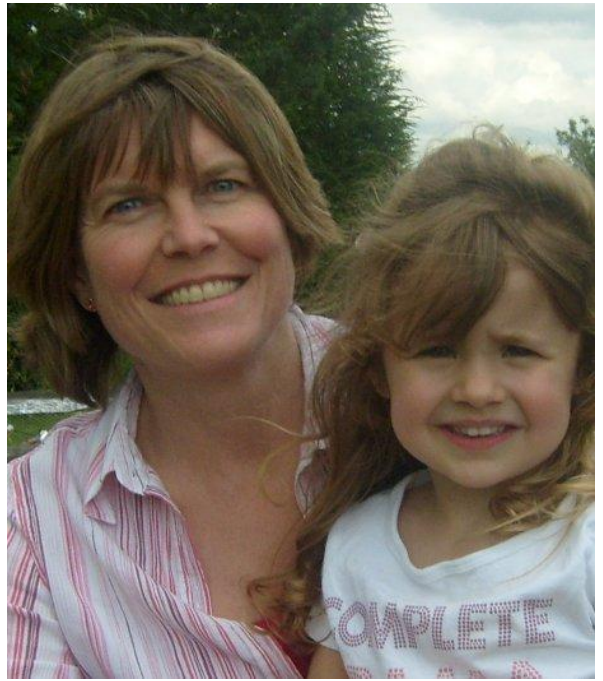

Spring must have arrived as the nursery grounds are awash with daffodils.

As discussed above the nursery is 20 this year and I can understand the worry etc that Graham and Fay have gone through over the years. I also, in 1991 was involved in the opening of a day nursery in what is now the Hilton Hotel at Stansted Airport. We opened a 15 place nursery with 3 children to start and when I left 3 years later we were full but I was unable to persuade the General Manager of the Hotel that it would be more profitable if they expanded to include babies. The nursery closed a few years later.

With regards to our birthday celebrations each child will receive a picture of the nursery's logo to colour. If you can return this to the nursery staff with your child's name and age on it they will be entered into a competition and may win a prize. I would also like to thank Mr and Mrs Pedley and family for the flowering Cherry tree they gave to the nursery to mark this happy day. We have planted it in our Eco field.

We have had our first Ofsted report looking at the way we implement the Early Years Foundation Stage which has encouraged us to look at the way we use our environment. After discussions with staff and management we have decided to make some changes to the 2-5 unit. This will



involve removing the partition wall between the Butterflies and Dragonflies. This will give all the children a better learning environment with designated areas for the six areas of learning. It will also enable the staff to interact better with the children through out the day.

The Ladybirds will still be based in their room but will at times have access to the larger room. The Butterflies and Dragonflies will keep their key persons and planning but will be able to interact and support each other which will encourage social skills.

If you wish to discuss these changes please talk to myself or Terri. We plan to move the rooms over the May Bank holiday weekend.

Sickness

Colds / flu / diarrhoea / vomiting

If your child is unwell please don't bring them into nursery to infect all the other children!

If your child has diarrhoea or sickness, please don't forget that they must be away for at **least 48 hours** from their last bout.

Also, your child mustn't come into nursery for 24 hours from the start of any antibiotics or eye drops.

Opening and Closing

Please bring your child into nursery at the start of their session (not before) and pick them up promptly at the end.

Don't forget - **late pick-ups and early drop off's will incur charges!**

AM session 9.00am - 12.30pm

If possible can you apply sun cream to your child before nursery but remember to inform a member of staff.

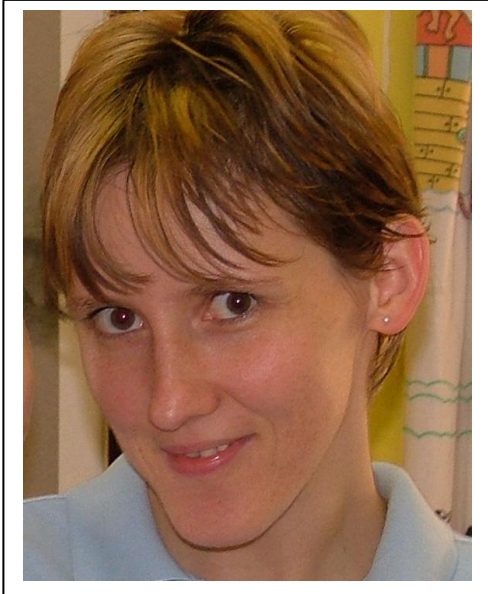
The staff will apply the

This will be our last term in this academic year. I feel weeks just flying by!

It is good that children can spend more time outside during the day and on our weekly PE sessions. The sunshine has arrived and hopefully here to stay!

We are making very good progress with the children. They are still eager to come into Betty's Room!

The younger children are enjoying their sound lessons and have just finished with their second blocks of six letter-sounds! This is promising as by the end of summer term they will be aware of **all** the 26.

Butterfly's room youngest ones have just finished learning them all. In the next term we are going to concentrate on recognising rhymes and rhyming pairs and using lots of rhyming activities to develop this skill.

The older children will carry on with rhyming and story work and in July our topic will be Going to School. I am sure by then they will be ready to think about it and will be enthusiastic to know more as they probably would have their first taster session.

Regarding writing we will carry on with practicing forming our letters correctly and if possible without any aid. In numeracy we are going to carry on working with shapes, measurements and numbers.

I would like to **Welcome** our new intakes: Monique, Sophia, Joseph, Zara, Abby and Eva. As always this time of the year becomes very difficult for me due to the high number of funded children. This year, as in previous years, I am going to share my teaching time with Leonie. Leonie will carry out the activities I plan with the new children. I am sad to announce that after seven wonderful years at the nursery I will be leaving Pilgrim's at the end of the summer term. I have been offered an opportunity to work as a full-time play therapist and to run Essex Child Therapy Services. I am very apprehensive and excited at the same time. I will miss the nursery, the children and the staff, but I will be back to visit!

In light of this new development, in the summer term I will be working four days a week from Monday to Thursday. During this time I will be closely involved overseeing the recruitment, training and guidance of my replacement. Terri's Page

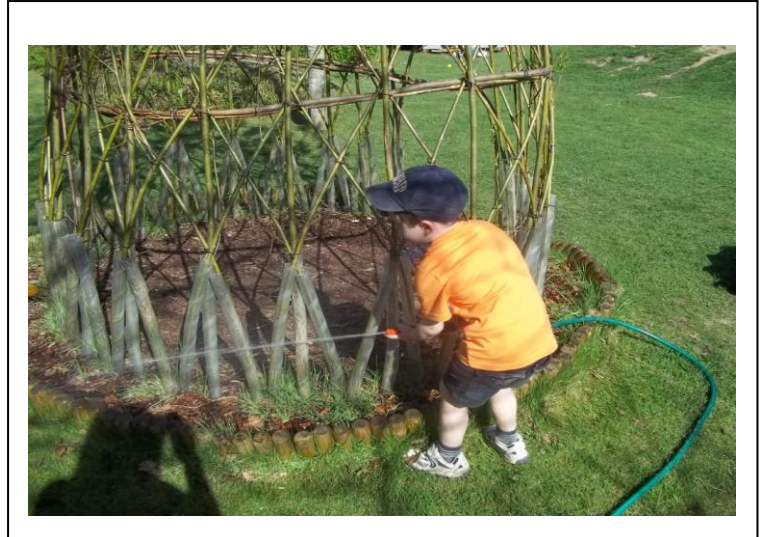

Please remember to label all items of clothing especially PE kits as we do get in a muddle sometimes- especially when we find a vest in the middle of the carpet which no one seems to recognise.

If your child has an accident during the day and has run out of their own spare clothes, they may borrow some nursery spares. Please make sure that these are washed and returned as soon as possible in case they are needed again. We also get through pants, socks and knickers like hot dinners! So if you have any old ones you would like to donate we would be very grateful for these.

We are seeing a lot more toys and money being brought to nursery. Please try to discourage your child from doing this, as well as contradicting the equality of all children, these precious items may get lost or go home with the wrong child. A small comforter may be brought in but needs to be returned to bags as early as possible so that children can commence their usual play and pursuits at nursery.
