I am a child of the fifties. This means that I was born in the Forties and that on average I am at least 25 years older than most of nursery Parents. In some cases possibly up to forty five years older! (and beyond)

The above trivia means that I really can remember long summers that have been as hot as the past Wimbledon week or so, almost too hot to breathe. Summers where the roads in Bocking we used to roller skate on melted in the heat, it was a morning activity.

Summer holidays where we really did go out in the morning, came in for lunch, then back out again, until it seemed almost night fall. There were evenings where Dads and their children would play cricket in the back fields, also Mums and Dads and their children would all be playing rounders together. Skipping was a girl and boy marathon activity. We made bows and arrows, catapults; slingshots (see David and Goliath). Dens and camps were made, fires lit, dams dug and streams blocked. We had air guns. Trees were for climbing and making swings from, if over the stream even better.

At the end of the harvest all of the straw in the fields was burnt – usually late evening, the fires could be seen all over the area, this method provided an important feed of pot ash for next years crop. As children do we were drawn to these fires – we helped (unofficially) the

farm workers. We learnt that the wind really can shift and the line of fire could change quickly and dangerously.

All of the above wonderful activities without supervision, H&S would have had apoplexy!

Where is this going you ask? Well I was fortunate to be at nursery when the children were taken through into the “eco field”. I counted either twenty or twenty one who were lined up just alongside the gate. Terri counted them down, “three two one GO!” and they just ran – and ran – and ran. Our children were like so many petals on the breeze, darting off in every direction and just running. They formed into groups or clusters towards the far end of the field, some were skipping along the path, others were in the “willow room” jumping up and down. The sight was truly glorious. I felt so privileged to have witnessed this explosion of child energy. It really made my heart sing with joy, to witness and enable our children to have the freedom to be outside without having to watch this watch that, be careful of the other.

To see our children experience in whatever way a little of the freedom that I had, and still treasure, as a child.

It's that time of year again when we say goodbye to most of the children in the pre-school room as they make the giant step to primary school. But we also welcome the children from the baby unit and of course new starters.

I would like to take this moment to say thank you for all your support over the last four years when I have been studying for my BA in Childhood Studies and my Early Years Professional Status. I had my final assessment on 29th July 2013 and I think it went well as I didn't receive a telephone call the next day to fill in the gaps. I now have up to three months to wait for my results. I feel I have learnt a great deal through my studies and will now put this into practice.

In order to help us improve our practice and our evaluation of the care and learning opportunities we offer your children, could you please fill in and return either by e-mail or as a hard copy the attached questionnaire. If your child is in the 2-5 unit you will receive a hard copy of a children's questionnaire for you to fill in with your child as we would like to find out what they think about their nursery experience. Can I also remind you, if you would like to change your sessions in September that we need to know as soon as possible. Thank you

I have placed a WOW! board in the baby unit. It is a way in which you can inform us of your child's likes and dislikes and anything they have done which makes you proud e.g slept through the night. There are pieces of card for you to write your comments and to display for everyone to see.

If your child is making the move to the 2-5 unit or is already in this unit, we ask that all children bring to nursery a labelled sports cup, outside



clothes suitable for all weathers and a spare set of clothes in a suitable bag not a carrier bag as this can be dangerous. Please can these items be labelled. Thank you.

Could I also remind you to inform your child's key person when your child has been ill over the weekend or on the days they don't attend nursery. This is so we can keep other parents informed of illnesses going round the nursery and we can be aware of why your child may be extra tired or irritable. Can I also refer you to our sickness policy as there are a few illnesses that require your child to stay away from nursery until they are well. If you require another copy please inform the office.

June our administrator, is on sick leave for at least the next few weeks so can I ask you to bear with me if you have any issues relating to invoices etc. Thank you.

If you have any concerns or wish to have a chat about your child's progress or any issues about your child please don't hesitate to ask myself, Tracey or Terri.

If your child is unwell please don't bring them into nursery to infect all the other children!

If your child has diarrhoea or sickness, please don't forget that they must be away for at **least 48 hours** from their last bout.

Also, your child mustn't come into nursery for 24 hours from the start

Opening and Closing

Please bring your child into nursery at the start of their session (not before) and pick them up promptly at the end.

Don't forget - **late pick-ups and early drop off's will incur charges!**

School Day 9.00am - 3.30pm

AM session 9.00am - 12.30pm

PM session 1.30pm - 5.00pm

Hot Summer days

We have had some very warm / hot summer days this year so can we remind you to bring in sun hats and sun cream for your child also a labeled water bottle if your child is in the 2-5 unit..

If possible can you apply sun cream to your child before nursery but remember to inform a member of staff.

The staff will apply the



cream when necessary and will fill in a form saying the time and date the cream was applied.

Please also ensure all clothing and belongings are labeled to avoid confusion and losses.

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
